



Erasmus+ Programme Inter-institutional agreement Key Action 1 Mobility of higher education students and staff between EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme

The institutions¹ named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. This agreement is valid for the Erasmus+ call years 2023-2026 in:

• KA171 Higher education mobility supported by external policy funds

¹ Inter-institutional agreements can be bilateral or multilateral in the case of mobility consortia:

⁻ Bilateral agreements are for cooperation between one higher education institution located in an EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme and another institution located in a third country not associated to the Programme

⁻ Multilateral agreements are for cooperation between a mobility consortium of higher education institutions located in one single EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme and another institution located in a third country not associated to the Programme.





The institutions commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+ and to respect the quality requirements of the Programme, outlined in the <u>Erasmus Charter for Higher Education</u>² and in this agreement.

The institutions agree on exchanging their mobility-related data according to the <u>principles</u> of <u>GDPR</u>³ and in line with the technical standards of the <u>European Student Card Initiative</u>⁴, when this becomes available for international mobility involving third countries not associated to the Programme.

Sending institutions located in EU/EEA countries have to ensure compliance with the provisions of art. 46 GDPR for all participants' personal data exchanged in the context of their mobility with institutions from non-EU/EEA countries without an adequacy decision, on the condition that enforceable data subject rights and effective legal remedies for data subjects are available in the respective third country. The participants should be informed in a transparent manner about the level of protection of their personal data, if this is different from the one where the sending institution is located.

However, after the publication of the final resolution each year, and in case of vacancies, other fields of knowledge and different levels of studies may be accepted, provided there is agreement and acceptance from both the home institution and the host institution.

The days/months indicated in this agreement correspond to the total approved by the Spanish National Agency for this Call. The number of positions mentioned above may change during the final year of the project, as a result of the transfer of available/vacant positions in other countries of the same region.

The main objective of this measure is to offer opportunities to interested students and staff members and to avoid leaving vacancies.

IMPORTANT NOTE

The numbers mentioned above may increase depending on the funds received each year for action KA171 during the current Erasmus+ program period.

4. Partnership arrangements: fees and organisational support funds

In accordance with the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education, partners commit to charge no additional fees to students:

- In connection with the organisation or administration of their Erasmus+ credit mobility period at their institution. Any violation to this rule by the partners shall be brought to the attention of the National Agency and may lead to the termination of the participation in the project linked to this inter-institutional agreement, if no corrective measures are taken.
- For tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions and the use of miscellaneous material.

Partners agree on the following use and repartition of organisational support funds including a list of objectives that both partners consider a priority:

Our primary goal is to enhance inclusion and diversity. UMA will share 20% of the Organizational Support with the partner institution for each participant with disabilities, properly nominated and duly accredited by the sending institution during the selection process. 5. Outreach and Selection of participants: calendar, application procedure and requirements

- Partners commit to doing outreach to participants with fewer opportunities to encourage their participation in the Programme and, where needed, agree on a common strategy to meet indicative inclusion targets.
- Partners commit to running selection procedures for mobility activities that are fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal opportunities to participants eligible for mobility. The calls for applications must be public and an appeal procedure must be in place. Under no circumstances, shall applicants and selected participants incur any costs during application and selection procedures.
- In the case of student mobility, partners will ensure that other elements beyond academic merit are taken into account to ensure participation of students with fewer opportunities. Selection criteria and procedures must be clearly communicated in the call for applications.



 All partner universities commit to actively disseminating the call for applications on their websites and social media platforms, and to communicate the call to local and regional media if necessary, in order to successfully spread information about the call

6. Preparation and support

The higher education institution(s) in an EU Member State or associated third country commit(s) to:

- Ensure that students are aware of their rights and obligations as defined in the Erasmus Student Charter⁸.
- To the extent possible, organize travel arrangements or provide pre-financing of the grant to reduce the costs that participants have to advance.

All involved higher education institutions commit to the following preparation and support measures. Information and guidance can be provided through the designated contact points and information sources detailed in the table below:

- The host institution will guide incoming participants in mobility activities in finding accommodation, in accordance with the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education. It is considered good practice to use the individual grant to pay for the deposit of university residences.
- Ensure that outgoing mobility participants are well-prepared for their activities abroad, including combined mobility, by implementing activities to achieve the necessary language proficiency level and develop their intercultural skills.
- Provide assistance for obtaining visas, when necessary, to incoming and outgoing mobility participants, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education, and, if necessary, use project funds in the most inclusive manner to partially or fully cover related costs.
- Provide assistance for obtaining insurance coverage, when necessary, to incoming and outgoing mobility participants, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education, and, if necessary, use project funds in the most inclusive manner to partially or fully cover related costs. The host institution will inform mobility participants of cases where insurance coverage is not provided automatically.
- The host institution will inform incoming participants with fewer opportunities about the relevant infrastructure and provide them with support.
- Provide appropriate mentoring and support mechanisms for mobility participants, including those engaging in combined mobility, and integrate incoming mobility participants into the general student community and everyday life of the institution.

- Provide participants with the grant they are entitled to as soon as possible upon their arrival, including, if necessary, an initial payment in cash, with a check or similar method to avoid delays associated with opening a bank account.
- The institutions commit to encouraging participants to act as ambassadors of the Erasmus+ program and to share their mobility experience, for example, by providing information about the existence of Erasmus+ alumni networks, inviting former participants to promotion/dissemination activities, etc.

- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending and receiving institutions or non-academic organisations and the mobile participants
- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement, or according to the learning outcomes of the modules completed abroad, as automatically counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Partners commit to taking measures to ensure recognition of student and staff mobility upon their return, including:
 - Providing incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with free-of-charge transcripts. The documents must be in English or in the language of the sending institution and containing a full, accurate and timely record of the achievements at the end of the mobility period.
 - ✓ A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
 - Providing students on traineeships and staff with a certificate for the activities completed. It is recommended to issue a certificate towards the end of the mobility period.



8. Grading systems of the institutions

It is recommended that receiving institutions provide the statistical distribution of grades or make the information available through <u>EGRACONS</u> according to the descriptions in the <u>ECTS users' guide</u> The table will facilitate the interpretation of each grade awarded to students and will facilitate the credit transfer by the sending institution.

10. Termination of the agreement

It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."
